Retired as professor and chair of the Department of Osteopathic Manipulative Medicine at COMP, he continues consulting with the school's Department of NMM/OMM on teaching, research, curriculum analysis and development, new faculty mentorships and Predoctoral OMM Fellows. He is involved with WUHS's Interprofessional Education program, and lectures part-time in the Graduate School of Basic Medical Sciences, among others. Memberships: AOA, AAO. Hollis H. King, DO, PhD, FAAO is a Fellow of and Past-President of the American Academy of Osteopathy. He is certified in Family Medicine by the American Board of Osteopathic Family Physicians. He has served on the faculties of several colleges of osteopathic medicine and most recently was Osteopathic Family Medicine Residency Director at the University of Wisconsin-Madison. He is currently a Clinical Professor of Family Medicine at the University of California San Diego School of Medicine. Texas College of Osteopathic Medicine, Fort

Dr. Seffinger, DO, graduated from Michigan State University College of Osteopathic Medicine in 1988, completed an osteopathic internship at Pacific Hospital of Long Beach in 1989 and a family medicine residency at

University of California at Irvine in 1991. He practiced osteopathic family medicine in Gardena, CA for 8 years. In 1999 he became a full-time faculty in the Department of Neuromusculoskeletal Medicine/Osteopathic Manipulative Medicine (NMM/OMM) at Western University of Health Sciences College of Osteopathic Medicine of the Pacific in Pomona, CA. He became a tenured Professor of Family Medicine and NMM/OMM and served as chair of the department from 2008-2014. Currently he is Professor Emeritus. He has a certificate of competency from the Osteopathic Cranial Academy, and is board certified in NMM/OMM. Dr. Seffinger served on the American Academy of Osteopathy Boards of Governors (2002-16) and Trustee (2004-2012) and was its President (2011-12) during its 75th anniversary. He also served the Osteopathic Physicians and Surgeons of California on its board and as the editor of its journal (2005-2009) and was a California delegate to the American Osteopathic Association House of Delegates. He served the AOA as Vice-Chair of the American Osteopathic Association Bureau of Osteopathic Clinical Education and Research (2000-2012). He was the Western Regional Director of the Osteopathic Research Center's Practice Based Research Network and has been engaged in several research projects related to the efficacy of osteopathic manipulative medicine. He served as vice chair of the Institutional Review

Board at Western University for 10 years, and Data and Safety Monitoring Board Chair for several multi-site clinical trials involving manipulation. He served as an Associate Editor of the Journal of the American Osteopathic Association (JAOA) (2010-2021). He is co-author of Evidence Based Manual Medicine, co-author of the “Somatic Connection” quarterly column in the JAOA, Executive Editor of the textbook, Foundations of Osteopathic Medicine, co-author of The Merger: MDs and DOs in California and Resurgence: The Rebirth of Osteopathic Medicine in California, as well as author of several book chapters, journal articles and editorials on the evidence base of osteopathic manipulative medicine. Dr. Seffinger began studying osteopathy under Dr. Frymann in 1984, and taught courses with her for 20 years from 1988-2008. He served with her on the Board of Directors of the Osteopathic Center for Children and Families until her retirement.
